What is an EHC assessment?

An EHC needs assessment is a detailed look at a child or young person's special educational needs (SEN) and the support he or she may need in order to learn. Local authorities are responsible for carrying out EHC needs assessments under the Children and Families Act 2014. An education, health and care (EHC) plan is for children and young people aged up to 25 who need more support than is available through special educational needs support.

EHC plans identify educational, health and social needs and set out the additional support to meet those needs.

Assessment Process

- 12 week assessment which supports creating the EHC Plan
- Strengths, needs, strategies, provision
- Observations of your child
- Multi agency working
- Liaison with parents
- Summative report
- Co-production of outcomes for the future
- Pupil voice
- Draft plan-15 days for comments
- Annual reviews
